## Legislation to Repeal Paid Family Leave Introduced



The bill was only recently signed by Governor Corzine and now two New Jersey Assembly legislators have introduced legislation to repeal the Paid Family Leave Act. Assemblyman Scott Rudder (R-Burlington 8) and Assemblywoman Dawn Marie Addiego (R-Burlington 8) introduced the repeal legislation on May 19 stating that the state's sluggish economy makes it imperative to repeal the paid family leave law that will drive jobs from the state.

Rudder and Addiego stated that recent surveys of New Jersey business owners indicate a loss of confidence in the state economy and that the tax and regulatory climate makes jobs growth impossible.

"The most recent job growth numbers show that our state has lost its competitive edge and that our taxpayers are losing employment opportunities," said Addiego.
